Even after working as a lifeboat crew member for 16 years, I'm still amazed at how some people overlook the simplest safety precautions - often leading to terrible consequences As the owner of a motor boat, you need to fully understand your craft and check it over thoroughly before setting out to sea

Surviving disaster - The Titanic and SOLAS
