Training regarding policies, procedures, and discipline-specific protocols, as well as on-the-job training and continuing education, are vital and should be considered. To become EPD certified, candidates must complete a three-day course and complete a 50-question written examination, achieving a score of at least 80 percent. The Public Safety Dispatchers' Basic Course has a minimum hourly requirement of 120 hours, which is divided into 14 individual topics, called Learning Domains. The Learning Domains contain the minimum required foundational information for given subjects, which are detailed in the publication Training Specifications for the Public Safety Dispatchers' Basic Course (pdf).

To be a 911 emergency dispatcher, it is necessary to have specific certification with a minimum of one year training. Obviously, you must have graduated high school or earned your GED as a required qualification. Many employees tend to favor candidates who have some experience in public safety, clerical services, or as a phone operator.

In Colorado, standards for hiring and training of emergency dispatchers vary from one municipality to another. Colorado is among the states that does not mandate a minimum level of emergency services training. However, individual agencies may offer a significant amount of classroom instruction as well as on-the-job training.

Training of Telecommunicators in areas such as Emergency Medical Dispatch, LEIN, NIMS and other federal, state, or locally required training is in addition to Modules I and II and is the responsibility of the employing agency.

Training Requirements Virginia has mandated a total of 80 hours of training, including 40 classroom hours. All public safety dispatchers must attend an academy through the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DJJC). Typically, students attend regional academies.

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
