Five Senses Activities for Kids -

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Teach Beside Me

Nerves relay the signals to the brain, which interprets them as sight (vision), sound (hearing), smell (olfaction), taste (gustation), and touch (tactile perception). 1. The Eyes Translate Light into Image Signals for the Brain to Process. The eyes sit in the orbits of the skull, protected by bone and fat.

The Five Senses - Human Body

The ways we understand and perceive the world around us as humans are known as senses. We have five traditional senses known as taste, smell, touch, hearing, and sight. The stimuli from each sensing organ in the body are relayed to different parts of the brain through various pathways. Sensory information is transmitted from the peripheral nervous system to the central nervous system.

List the five senses -- sight, smell,

Five Senses (See, Hear, Touch, Smell, Taste)

A typical example is Gérard de Lairese's Allegory of the Five Senses (1668), in

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which each of the figures in the main group alludes to a sense: Sight is the reclining boy with a convex mirror, hearing is the cupid-like boy with a triangle, smell is represented by the girl with flowers, taste is represented by the woman with the fruit, and touch is represented by the woman holding the bird.

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
