It depends mainly on the hitch and vehicle specifications. The Class V hitches, which are used as WC (weight carrying) are rated to 12,000 lbs. GTW (gross trailer weight) and it can handle the maximum weight of 1200 lbs for trailer tongue (TW).

The trailer hitches, of which there are four classes, have been defined by the SAE (Society of Automotive Engineers) based on the trailer's weight and the cargo and the Gross Weight Towed Weight Rating (GTWR).
